# **DAKSHIN DINAJPUR**

#### **Overall scenario of the district**

Dakshin Dinajpur district is situated in the north Bengal. It is surrounded by Malda and North Dinajpur district. It also shares international boundary with Bangladesh.

Dakshin Dinajpur is predominantly an agricultural district with large area of land being under cultivation. The district is drained by a number of North-South flowing rivers like Atreyee, Purnabhaba, Tangon and Brahmani, to give rise to a sizeable but unorganized fishing community.

According to Census Data (2011), the Total Population of the district is 16,70,931 out of which there are 8,55,104 males (51.17%) & 8,15,827 females (48.83%). The population density in the district is 753 persons per sq km.





It has been observed that one of the major sources of water for food processing units in West Bengal is ground water.


Block wise average depth of ground water during April, 2011 in the district is shown below:

## **Investment opportunities:**

- > The district has no significant strength in terms of production of processable items other than paddy.
- > It holds rank 4<sup>th</sup> in sweet potato and 5<sup>th</sup> in radish which have very limited scope for processing.
- ➤ However micro and small units, based on regular demand (like bakery, rice processing, oil processing, puffed rice) of the local people cab be set up in the district.
