

FAQs related to the Directorate of Cinchona & Other Medicinal Plants

- 1. What steps/action has been taken by the Directorate of Cinchona & Other Medicinal Plants, West Bengal to resolve the matter of appointment/recruitment of Group-D employees from the daily rated labourer's of cinchona plantation? Kindly provide relevant documents regarding movement of this issue to the Government.**

- c) **A copy of the correspondence by the Cinchona Directorate to the Department of the Land & Land Reforms about the Cinchona Plantation land dispute with the Forest Department.**
